Clerk Report – Update given on Pasture House planning. Update given on Mr M Wilson barn from highways.

New Parish Council member – After canvassing for the last few years Mr J Piggott expressed an interest in becoming a parish councillor for Glassonby. Planning – 2023/1152 Hartside Cafe – New cafe rebuild – plans in circulation
23/0768 Hilltop Farm Gamblesby – alterations to house – no objections
2023/1102 – Sycamore House – Prior notice of agricultural Shed – no response requested

Highways - Glassonby – several lights out, large number of potholes, gully blocked on voil moor, gullies in Glassonby down back lane full. Gamblesby several pot holes, water problem on Melmerby road, large potholes near Unthank. The clerk to report.

Glassonby Play Area Trees – A resident had asked one of the parish councillors if one of the Play area trees could be cut back. The Clerk to find out when the last tree survey was done and report back to the parish councillors.

20 Mph speed limits - It was agreed to put in the application for a 20mph speed limit in all three villages.

Reports from Councillors – 20mph speed limits and road poverty are high on the councils agenda. The Stoneybeck development park and m6 closures for the six bridges needing being repaired from 2026-2029 was discussed. The A66 bypass will have a decision in march. Council are busy looking at precept and budgets this next few months.

Comments from members of the public. - Add to next meeting agenda the cricket pitch. Lacey caves footpath was also mention – are there any grants available ? The buidling on the Cricket pitch is in need of a new roof which will be dealt with by the Cricket club.
